# **SUMMARY**

In 2021/2022, DEVATOP Centre for Africa Development implemented two projects:

- 1. The "Talkam Against Trafficking and Abuse" project is a significant initiative funded by Pamplona City, Spain, and supported by Accion Contra la Trata. Implemented by Devatop Centre for Africa Development, the project targets three states in Nigeria: the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Edo State, and Enugu State. It spans all six area councils of FCT, three geopolitical zones in Edo State, and three local governments in Enugu State.
- 2.TALKAM Against Human Rights Abuse

The project is designed to stimulate community-based reporting on trafficking and abuse, and to support victims with entrepreneurial skills as part of their reintegration process.

# Key objectives include:

Educating 3,100 youth across 12 secondary and tertiary institutions in the targeted regions by 2022.

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND IMPACT

**Strategic planning workshop with stakeholders:** The workshop was set out in February 2022 to engage 10 stakeholders who will support in designing the strategies to adopt in implementing the project especially in terms of risk management and mitigation plan. This activity had 11 stakeholders participating in the meeting, 5 out of which pledged their full support to the project, while the rest promised to provide their support as the project progresses.

TALKAM weekly radio program: The hosting of weekly radio programs in FCT, Edo and Enugu state was to raise awareness on the ills and forms of gender-based violence and human trafficking in person, and educate the public on the preventive measures for these practices. Between May to December, 2022, an estimated 13 million people were reached through the radio program, with 1462 listeners engaging via social media streaming and 20 phone calls for clarification. Through the radio program in FCT, the total number of 700,000 million persons has been sensitized and a total listenership of 1,050,000 for Edo. Making a total of 1, 750 000 persons sensitized via the state TALAKAM Radio Program.

Capacity Building for teachers: This activity was set out to enhance the capacity of Teachers to tackle Human Trafficking and Violence Against Women and was accomplished on a spread June to September 2022. A total of 30 teachers were trained. The 30 teachers who participated in the training on Talkam Against Human Trafficking and Abuse have an average score of 76% before the training and 79% after the training. The 30 trained teachers in FCT, Edo state and Enugu state conducted sensitization in their various schools. A total number of 2880 of students were sensitized across the implementation states

Entrepreneurship support to survivors: This activity provided capacity building and support to 20 female survivors on entrepreneurship in the Federal Capital Territory and Edo State. Through this activity, a total number of 20 vulnerable survivors of human trafficking were trained on Business management training and 4 with the best business idea were given one hundred thousand naira (N100,000) each to support their already existing business and to start up new ones. Also, business materials (business cards and letterheads) were printed and donated to the survivors. DEVATOP will also provide one-year ICT support for survivors to help them use their websites to attract customers. DEVATOP. Also, a website was developed for 3 businesses, business cards for 3 businesses and 3 business logos designed for 3 businesses to support their smooth running. Two survivors were also supported with tuition fee and medical fees to help them in their rehabilitation process


Awareness Campaign: A total number of 188 persons were sensitized through RedCard2TIP sport competition in secondary schools and awareness campaigns in tertiary institutions in Abuja. 1,500 people were reached through social media, (twitter and Facebook) 200 followers engaged on posts made via the media.

**Use Of Talkam Human Right App To Report Case:** Awareness of the app was created across states of implementation, by NAPTIP and social media. A total number of 18 cases were reported through the TALKAM App and other platforms

# MONITORING AND EVALUATION



# SUMMARIZED ACTIVITIES VS TARGETS RESULTS FRAMEWORK






# Trained Advocates and their States of Residence



# KNOWLEDGE BASED ASSESSMENT OF PARTICIPANTS OF THE CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP

Assessment of the knowledge of the 30 trained teachers was carried out through the administration of questionnaires in a pretest/posttest format to assess their before and after knowledge. An average score of 76% pretest was recorded and 79% post test recorded was achieved during the training. This shows that participants have 3% increased in knowledge on Tackling Human Trafficking and Violence Against Women.



# **SUCCESS STORIES**

During the implementation of the TALKAM Against Trafficking and Abuse Project (TATA), several notable successes were achieved. One key achievement was the mobilization of resources for a trafficking survivor who had returned through IOM's assisted voluntary return program in 2017. Although her initial project had ended, Devatop successfully collaborated with IOM to secure economic support for her reintegration, enabling her to start her business.

The project also provided unexpected medical support to a victim, ensuring she received necessary care through partnerships with individuals offering free services. Additionally, TATA facilitated tuition support for two young survivors of rape, helping them overcome their trauma and return to school, with the aim of fulfilling their dreams of becoming a doctor and a lawyer.

In terms of policy development, the project initiated the creation of policies on Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and Trafficking in Persons (TIP) in educational institutions in Enugu State and FCT College of Education Zuba. This effort involved collaboration with NAPTIP to guide students and teachers, reflecting the project's broader impact on institutional change.

Lastly, TATA provided business support to four survivors, assisting with business registration, website development, and branding, which helped solidify their ventures and enhance their economic independence. These successes demonstrate the project's comprehensive approach to combating trafficking and supporting survivors.

### **GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP**

Our organization is committed to eradicating trafficking in persons and addressing gender-based violence (GBV) through robust governance and visionary leadership. The executive team, supported by a dedicated board of trustees, ensures that our strategies are aligned with global best practices and are effectively implemented at all levels. By fostering a culture of transparency and accountability, our leadership guarantees that our initiatives are both impactful and sustainable.
